People use the terms dolphins, porpoises, and whales to describe marine mammals belonging to the order Cetacea (from the Greek word ketos, "large sea creature"), and often use them interchangeably. The orca, or killer whale, for example, is actually the largest member of the dolphin family.

What's the difference between dolphins and porpoises?

The term "whales" here includes all cetaceans (whales, dolphins, and porpoises), which are a diverse group of animals ranging in size from just a few feet long to over 100 feet long. While most whales spend their lives offshore in the ocean's pelagic zone, some inhabit coastal areas and even spend part of their lives in fresh water.

Dolphins and porpoises are small toothed whales, or 'odontocetes' which means 'toothed sea-monster' in Greek. They are grouped into six families; the ocean dolphins are the biggest family with 38 species; there are four river dolphin families each with only one member; and one porpoise family containing all seven porpoise species.

Sperm whales, narwhals, many members of the beaked whale family, several species of the porpoise family, killer whales, pilot whales, eastern spinner dolphins and northern right whale dolphins show this characteristic. Males in these species developed external features absent in females that are advantageous in combat or display.
